

Azobe



Azobe - is found in West Africa and extends into the Congo basin. The heartwood is dark red, chocolate-brown, or purple- brown with conspicuous white deposits in the pores (vessels). The texture is coarse, and the grain is usually interlocked. Azobe is very resistant to acid and has good weathering properties. It is also resistant to teredo attack. The heartwood is extremely resistant to preservative treatment. Azobe is ideal for any outdoor use - on both damp and dry ground and in fresh or salt water. It seems to last "forever". **Azobe is the hardest industrially used wood in the world.**

Grade - FAS, primare - AD. Density: 960 - 1120 kg/m³
